IN TEXT

- follow the pattern (author's/editor's last name year, page x–y)

Example (1): . . . the sum of all atoms in the model, it corresponds to the concept of kind (Chierchia 1998, p. 88) in natural language . . .

Example (2): The primary function of demonstrative pronouns is deictic (Black et al. 1987, pp. 81–104).

Example (3): Recent proposals, such as the one made by Bale and Khanjian (2009), shed some light on this issue . . .
